OUR MISSION

To assist in providing free upper limb orthopedic care for underand uninsured professional musicians across the country.

We know that a single injury can end a musician's career. The Musician Treatment Foundation (MTF) is dedicated to helping injured musicians reclaim their talent, resume their passion, recover their livelihoods, and keep the music playing for us all.

Professional musicians create, perform, record, and rehearse music often away from home and personal and medical support systems. Injuries can arise without warning from the repetitive intensity of playing instruments as well as unexpected accidents MTF is a unique nonprofit that facilitates and funds upper limb treatment and continuity of care for eligible musicians at home and on the road. We do so with our special nationwide network of like-minded orthopedic surgeons, Physicians for Musicians.

Our mission is driven by five initiatives:

- 1. CARE for the injured shoulders, elbows, and hands of eligible professional musicians.
- 2. EDUCATE musicians on upper limb injuries and preventative techniques that will minimize or prevent musician-specific injuries.
- 3. BUILD the first physician-surgeon network and musician registry dedicated to facilitating care across the country.
- 4. CREATE the first platform to allow specialized remote preoperative, postoperative, and non-operative continuity of care.
- 5. SHARE new research and outcomes data with the world to illuminate the unique diagnostic and treatment issues facing all musicians.

Since our inception in 2017 as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, MTF has assisted in providing free surgical and non-surgical care for eligible professional musicians valued at over \$2.7 million.
